A. FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE - Todd Kraus Chair, Ben Juzeszyn

- CONSIDER A MOTION APPROVING THE TREASURER'S REPORT.
- 2. VARIANCE REPORTS are enclosed for your review.
- 3. CONSIDER A MOTION APPROVING THE LIST OF BILLS AND PAYROLL.
- 4. CONSIDER AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING A TAX LEVY FOR 2023 COLLECTIBLE IN 2024. Staff has prepared two ordinances: one at a 2% increase as authorized, and a second at a 0% increase (or the same as last year). The difference of the two levies is \$13,392; or about \$7.75 per tax bill in the Village. This item was tabled at the November 27, 2023 meeting but will require a vote at this meeting.
- 5. CONSIDER AN ORDINANCE TO ADDRESS THE ILLINOIS PAID LEAVE FOR ALL WORKERS ACT. This Act is effective January 1, 2024. The Personnel Manual will be updated accordingly to ensure compliance with State law.
- 6. CONSIDER AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE BORROWING OF FUNDS FROM FIRST COMMUNITY BANK IN THE AMOUNT OF \$650,000 FOR THE PENFIELD STREET IMPROVEMENT PROJECT. The loan will have an interest rate of 4.05% and will be repaid in 10 years.
- 7. CONSIDER A LOCAL PUBLIC AGENCY RESOLUTION OF INTENT AUTHORIZING THE USE OF MFT FUNDS TO REPAY THE \$650,000 LOAN FOR THE PENFIELD STREET IMPROVEMENT PROJECT. This is a requirement of IDOT if the Village intends to use MFT funds to repay the loan that was just approved. This was the original intent of the Village at the initiation of this project.
- 8. CONSIDER A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING LINE-ITEM TRANSFERS TO THE BUDGET FOR FY23/24 TO COVER THE OVERLAP OF VILLAGE ADMINISTRATORS. To prepare for the transition \$30,000 was already placed in the budget to cover the cost of onboarding a new Administrator. Now that the costs are known the proper transfers can occur to balance the line items of the budget pertaining to this transition. Total amount to be transferred is \$21,222.77 which is less than was budgeted.

Currently there is a leak at Well #5 and staff recommends replacing the lines at Well #4 at the same time to prevent issues in the future and maintain consistency.
- 8. CONSIDER A MOTION TO WAIVE THE FORMAL BID PROCESS TO COMPLETE EMERGENCY REHAB WORK AT THE FAIRWAY DRIVE LIFT STATION. Currently the lift station is functioning on a temporary fix which is allowing the pipe to continue leaking into the pit. The rehab will be replacing 2 pumps and necessary materials most of which are original from 1994.
- 9. CONSIDER A MOTION APPROVING SUPERIOR PUMPING SERVICES TO COMPLETE EMERGENCY REHAB WORK AT THE FAIRWAY DRIVE LIFT STATION IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$85,000.00. A proposal in the amount of \$63,448 for a portion of the rehab is enclosed. Superior is completing an estimate for the electrical control portion of the rehab, and this estimate is not expected to exceed \$15,000. Funds will be borrowed from the General Fund to complete this project because Water and Sewer funds are earmarked for the Dixie Highway Watermain Crossover Project.

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE PRESIDENT & BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BEECHER HELD AT THE BEECHER VILLAGE HALL, 625 DIXIE HIGHWAY, BEECHER, ILLINOIS NOVEMBER 27, 2023 -- 7:00 P.M.

All present joined in the Pledge to the Flag.

President Meyer called the meeting to order.

ROLL CALL

PRESENT: President Meyer and Trustees Juzeszyn, Kraus, Gardner, Stacey, Tieri and Gianotti. ABSENT: None.

STAFF PRESENT: Clerk Janett McCawley, Administrator Charity Mitchell, Deputy Administrator Robert Barber, Public Works Superintendent Matt Conner, Chief Terry Lemming and EMA Director Bob Heim.

GUESTS: George Schuitema, Sal Llamas, Cynthia White-Wilson and three others representing craft grow cannabis facility.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

President Meyer asked for consideration of the minutes of the November 13, 2023 Board meeting. Trustee Kraus made a motion to approve the minutes as written. Trustee Gardner seconded.

AYES: (6) Trustees Juzeszyn, Kraus, Gardner, Stacey, Tieri and Gianotti.

NAYS: (0) None.

Motion carried.

VILLAGE CLERK REPORT

Clerk informed the Board about thank you cards sent to Deputy Administrator Barber, Superintendent Conner and Youssef Chimon regarding help with a sewer problem related to the Penfield Street project. Resident was very appreciative of the time spent helping her.

RECOGNITION OF AUDIENCE – None.

VILLAGE PRESIDENT REPORT

The Planning, Building and Zoning Committee agenda items were discussed out of order.

ORDINANCE #1395 – An Ordinance authorizing a special use permit for a craft grow cannabis facility at 744 W. Church Road by Cynthia White-Wilson. The Planning and Zoning Commission held a public hearing and unanimously recommended approval of the craft grow facility to be

located approximately 1,000 feet north of Church Road, just east of the railroad tracks, with three conditions:

- a. A site plan be provided showing the exact locations of buildings and site improvements including all setbacks.
- b. A drainage plan must be submitted and approved by the Village Engineer.
- c. The layout must provide adequate turning radius for fire equipment.

The petitioners were present to answer any questions. Petitioner estimated it to be a 40,000-sf facility. Trustee Gardner made a motion to approve Ordinance #1395 subject to the three conditions specified above. Trustee Kraus seconded.

AYES: (6) Trustees Juzeszyn, Kraus, Gardner, Stacey, Tieri and Gianotti.

NAYS: (0) None. Motion carried.

The Zoning Ordinance Steering Committee met to go over the first draft of the sign code. The proposed language will be presented to the PZC at their next meeting on January 25, 2024.

FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE

Trustee Kraus made a motion to approve payment of the list of bills in the amount of \$52,345.16 and payroll since the last meeting. Trustee Juzeszyn seconded.

AYES: (6) Trustees Juzeszyn, Kraus, Gardner, Stacey, Tieri and Gianotti.

NAYS: (0) None.

Motion carried.

The tax levy for 2023 collectible in 2024 was considered. The Board discussed the difference to be collected in the levies depending on a 2% increase or 0% increase tax levy. Trustee Kraus recommended going with the 0% levy increase this year and reconsider next year. There was some discussion regarding the increase in dispatching fees as well as other increasing costs and if Village has ways to pay these future increases without a tax levy increase. An increase in the sewer fees will also be considered next year to cover costs in the sewer fund. Trustee Kraus made a motion to adopt a 0% increase tax levy. Motion died due to a lack of a second.

Discussion of the tax levy was then tabled and will be placed on the December 11th Board meeting agenda.

Comcast will be raising rates for 2024. A letter about the changes was provided.

PUBLIC BUILDINGS AND PROPERTIES, PARKS AND RECREATION COMMITTEE

Trustee Gianotti made a motion to approve a proposal from Piggush Engineering in the amount of \$12,680 to move the police station south, eliminate parking and retaining walls and to change grades. Trustee Kraus seconded.

AYES: (6) Trustees Juzeszyn, Kraus, Gardner, Stacey, Tieri and Gianotti.

NAYS: (0) None.

Motion carried.

Trustee Gianotti made a motion letting bids for the redesigned police facility according to the bid schedule provided to the Board. Trustee Kraus seconded the motion.

AYES: (6) Trustees Juzeszyn, Kraus, Gardner, Stacey, Tieri and Gianotti.

NAYS: (0) None. Motion carried.

<u>PLANNING</u>, <u>BUILDING</u> <u>AND</u> <u>ZONING</u> <u>COMMITTEE</u> – Agenda items were discussed under Village President's report.

PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE

An update on the adjudication joint court with Peotone was provided by Trustee Tieri. A second meeting was held with Peotone and it was decided that Beecher and Peotone would create our own spreadsheets and ticket tracking system without the software cost of \$1,500 per month per department. The fourth Wednesday of each month at 10 a.m. at the Washington Township Center would be the administrative hearing date starting in March or April. An intergovernmental agreement would need to be approved between Beecher and Peotone. Peotone is currently working on the agreement.

PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE

The Water Department monthly report and billing register were provided in the packet for review.

A Penfield Street project update was provided. Bridge is still closed and waiting on safety railings. Railings should be installed this week and then the entire road will be reopened. All should be done by the end of the year except for the final lift to occur next year.

A railroad quiet zone update was provided. The delineators need to be reinstalled on Penfield Street east of the railroad tracks and the railroad crossing signage needs to be reinstalled at Hodges Street and at Penfield Street. The railroad will then be contacted to reinstitute the quiet zone.

A leaf collection update was provided. Collection is still underway. The scheduled end date for leaf collection is December 7th for final pass through town.

A Dixie Highway watermain crossover project update was provided. The project is ready for bid opening on Thursday, November 30th. There is \$1,277,000 available for the project which includes \$500,000 in Will County ARPA grant funds. A proposed financing plan was provided.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND COMMUNITY RELATIONS COMMITTEE

The results of the tree lighting ceremony held on Sunday was provided by Trustee Juzeszyn. He thanked everyone who helped with this event and listed the many people and organizations that contributed towards the event. There was a pretty good turnout despite the cold and windy conditions. Trustee Juzeszyn asked if next year EMA could help with the Santa's workshop because they didn't have enough people to help this year.

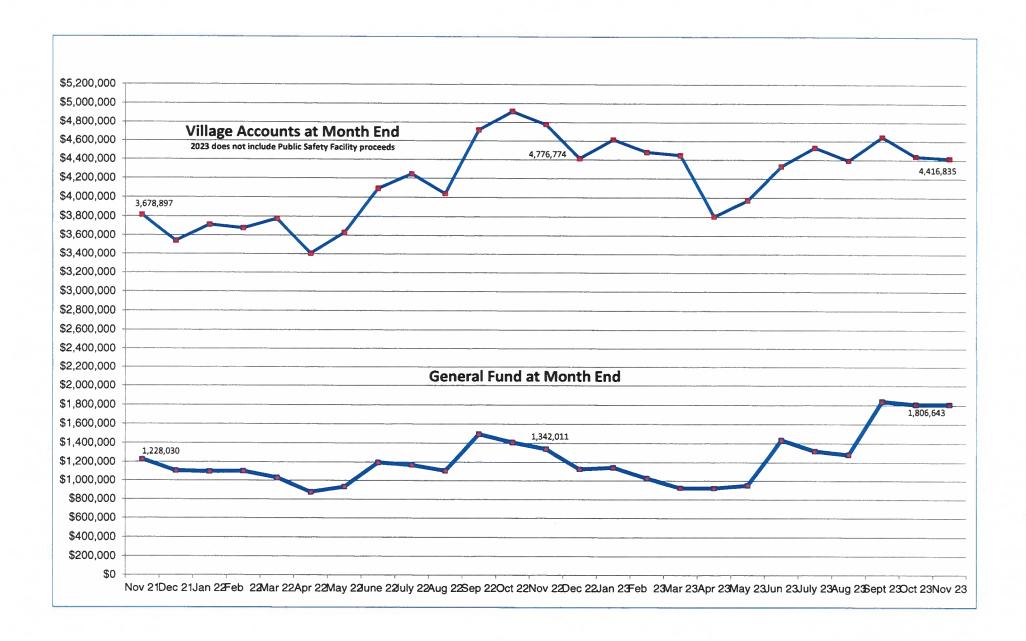

AN ORDINANCE REGARDING THE ILLINOIS PAID LEAVE FOR ALL WORKERS ACT FOR THE VILLAGE OF BEECHER, WILL COUNTY, ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/1-2-1, provides that the corporate authorities of each municipality may pass all ordinances and make all rules and regulations proper or necessary, to carry into effect the powers granted to municipalities, with such fines or penalties as may be deemed proper; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Beecher is a non-home rule Illinois municipality; and

WHEREAS, on or about March 12, 2023, Governor JB Pritzker signed into law the Paid Leave for All Workers Act (820 ILCS 192/1 et seq.) (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois did not make the necessary appropriations or include statutory language exempting the Act from the Illinois State Mandates Act (30 ILCS 805/1 et seq.); and

WHEREAS, effective January 1, 2024, the Act requires an employer to provide certain paid leave to their employees, unless the employer is subject to an existing municipal or county ordinance that requires the employer to provide any form of paid leave to their employees; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Beecher recognizes the importance of paid leave and currently provides reasonable paid leave benefits to its employees; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Beecher has determined that applying the Act to its own employees will negatively impact the Village and place an undue financial and operational burden on the Village's ability to provide uninterrupted services to its residents; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Beecher believes and hereby declares that it is in the best interests of the Village to clearly define the paid leave benefits that Village employees shall receive.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained, by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Beecher, Will County, Illinois as follows:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals shall be and are hereby incorporated as findings of fact as if said recitals were fully set forth herein.

Section 2. Pursuant to Section 15(p) of the Act, the Village of Beecher hereby adopts its current paid leave policy for all Village employees as set forth in the Village's Code of Ordinances, Employee Handbook, Annual Salary Ordinances, any collective bargaining

agreements to which the Village is a party and all other binding legislative actions governing paid leave adopted by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Beecher as the same may be amended from time to time. However, in no event shall the Village, as an employer, provide less than one (1) day of paid leave per year to any Village employee.

Section 3. Repeal of Conflicting Provisions. All ordinances, resolutions, and policies or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of the conflict, expressly repealed on the effective date of this Ordinance.

Section 4. Severability. If any provision of this Ordinance or application thereof to any person or circumstance is ruled unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Ordinance that can be given effect without the invalid application or provision, and each invalid provision or invalid application of this Ordinance is severable.

Section 5. The clerk is directed by the corporate authorities to publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage and publication in accordance with 65 ILCS 5/1-2-4.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE BORROWING OF \$650,000 FROM FIRST COMMUNITY BANK AND TRUST FOR THE PENFIELD STREET PROJECT.

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Beecher, Will County, Illinois, have been advised that it is necessary for the Village to borrow \$650,000 for the Village's portion of the Penfield Street Improvement project; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Beecher, Will County, Illinois, through the Village Treasurer, have solicited proposals to borrow the required \$650,000; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Beecher, Will County, Illinois, have been advised by the Village Treasurer that First Community Bank and Trust provided the best proposal to lend the Village the principal amount of \$650,000 with an interest rate of \$4.05% payable with equal monthly installments payments of principal and interest; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Beecher, Will County, Illinois, have been advised by the Village Attorney that 65 ILCS 5/8-1-3.1 allows the Corporate Authorities to borrow money from a bank provided such money is repaid within 10 years and authorization is given to the Village President to execute any debt obligation for such purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of this Village of Beecher, Will County, Illinois, after receiving advice from the Village Attorney and recommendations of the Village Treasurer, now concur that it is advisable, necessary, and in the best interests of the residents of the Village of Beecher that the Village President be authorized to sign loan documents and any associated documents for \$650,000 from First Community Bank and Trust for the Village's portion of the Penfield Street Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BEECHER, WILL COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION ONE: That the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Beecher, Will County, Illinois, hereby find as facts all of the recitals in the "Whereas" clauses of this Ordinance.

SECTION TWO: That the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Beecher, Will County, Illinois, hereby authorize the borrowing of \$650,000 from First Community Bank and Trust for ten years at a rate of ______% per annum with monthly with monthly principal and interest payments over the ten-year term, and that the President, Treasurer, and Village Clerk are hereby authorized to execute and attest any documents with the First Community Bank and Trust for such purposes. The Village Clerk shall duly affix the Corporate Seal of the Village thereto. The Village Treasurer is hereby authorized to make the required payments via ACH.

SECTION THREE: That the \$650,000 loan proceeds shall be deposited into a separate MFT Bond account and the loan shall be repaid utilizing the Motor Fuel Tax monies received by the Village.

SECTION FOUR:

If any section, clause, provision or portion of this Ordinance shall be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect any other section, clause, provision or portion of this Ordinance.

SECTION FIVE: That this Ordinance shall take effect, and be in full force and effect, from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

Ladies and Gentlemen:

As the Attorney for the Village of Beecher, Will County, Illinois (the "Village"), we have represented the Village and the Board of Trustees thereof (the "Board") in connection with the issuance on this date by the Village of its \$650,000 General Obligation Limited Tax Debt (the "Debt Obligation"), and we have examined the public records, proceedings, and documents of the Village in connection with the issuance of the Debt Obligation which we consider necessary for the purpose of this opinion, including the following:

- (a) Ordinance No. 2023-_____ (the "Debt Obligation Ordinance"), duly adopted by the Board on the 11th day of December, 2023 ("Village Proceedings"); and
- (b) Certification dated December ____, 2023, by the Village Clerk with December 11, 2023 Village Board Meeting Minutes.

Based upon the foregoing and upon such other information and documents furnished to us as we believe necessary to enable us to render this opinion, we are of the following opinion:

- 1. The Village is a duly organized municipality of the State of Illinois, operating, among other laws, under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code of the State of Illinois, as amended, the Open Meetings Act, as amended, the Local Government Debt Reform Act, as amended, and 65 ILCS 5/8-1-3.1 (collectively, "Illinois Law").
- 2. The Village Proceedings are presently in full force and effect and have not been repealed or rescinded or amended; and the Board has not adopted any other ordinance, resolution, or other proceeding affecting in any manner the procedures for or the issuance of the Debt Obligation.
- 3. The Village has no special ordinances of limitation or procedural ordinance, rule, or order relating to the issuance of general obligation corporate purpose bonds, notes, or Debt Obligations for corporate purposes without referendum; and there is

no Village-imposed limitation upon the amount of its existing debt different in any way than Illinois Law.

- 4. The Village Proceedings were held in compliance with Illinois Law and applicable Village procedures, and additionally, specifically in compliance with 65 ILCS 5/8-1-3.1.
- 5. The Debt Obligation was duly authorized in the Ordinance and once duly executed and delivered by proper officers of the Village as so authorized, and assuming, in the case of multiparty documents, the due authorization, execution, and delivery by the other parties thereto, will constitute the valid and binding agreement of the Village.
- After due inquiry of appropriate Village officials and agents and to the best of our knowledge and belief, (a) there is no action, suit, proceeding, or investigation, at law or in equity, before or by any court or any governmental agency or public board or body, pending against the Village or, to my knowledge, threatened against the Village, to restrain or enjoin, or threatening or seeking to restrain or enjoin, the issuance, sale, or delivery of the Debt Obligation or affecting (1) the Village Proceedings; (2) the validity or enforceability of any provision of the Debt Obligation or any of the Village Proceedings; (3) the authority of the Village to impose or collect the taxes; or (4) the legal existence of the Village, the right of its officers to their offices, the Village's authority to perform its obligations pursuant to the Village Proceedings or with respect to the Debt Obligation or to consummate any of the transactions to which it is or is to be a party as contemplated by the Village Proceedings; and (b) there is no action, suit, proceeding, or investigation, at law or in equity, before or by any court or any governmental agency or public board or body, pending against the Village or, to my knowledge, threatened against the Village, involving any of the property or assets within the Village which may result in any material adverse change in the revenues, assets, or the financial condition of the Village.
- 7. Upon due inquiry of Village officials and agents, to the best of our knowledge and belief, there is no action, suit, proceeding, or investigation at law or in equity before or by any court, public board, or body pending, threatened against, or affecting the Village wherein an unfavorable decision, ruling, or finding would in our judgment in any way materially and adversely affect the transactions described in or contemplated by any of the Village Proceedings or the validity or enforceability of the Debt Obligation.
- 8. There is no lien or encumbrance on any of the taxes or the other funds pledged to the payment of the Debt Obligation that is senior to the claims of the holders of the Debt Obligation; there is to my knowledge no existing, pending, threatened, or anticipated event or circumstance which might give rise to any lien or encumbrance on any such taxes or the other funds pledged to the payment of the Debt Obligation which would be senior to the claims of the holders of the Debt Obligation.

- 9. No additional approval, permit, consent, authorization, or order from any court or any governmental or public agency, authority, or person not already obtained is required with respect to the authority of the Village in connection with the authorization, issuance, and sale to the Purchaser of the Debt Obligation or for the adoption or effectiveness of any of the Village Proceedings.
- 10. That as of the date of this letter, it is our opinion that the Debt Obligation is a "qualified tax-exempt obligation" for the purposes and within the meaning of Section 265(b)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.
- 11. As of the date of this opinion, the adoption of the Village Proceedings, the execution of delivery by the Village of the Debt Obligation and compliance by the Village with the provisions thereof under the circumstances contemplated thereby, do not and will not violate any applicable judgment, order, or regulations of any court or of any public or governmental agency or authority of the State of Illinois and will not conflict with or result in a breach of any of the terms and provisions of or constitute a default under any existing law, court or administrative regulation decree, order, or any agreement, indenture, mortgage, lease, or other instrument to which the Village is subject or by which it is or may be bound.

A. Schedule Pertaining to Redesign and Rebidding of Project

1. Project description

 The reduced floor plan is approximately 9,491 s.f. complete with full site development, municipal police functions, and community room.

2. Project bid schedule

i. JMA and its engineering consultants are planning to have all drawing and bid documents prepared for release by 12/29/2023. However, Piggush Engineering has indicated that based on their current project commitments, they may not be able to finish their drawing revisions until 1/5/2024. This correspondence shall serve as a follow-up on our discussion regarding the above-referenced matter. Specifically, it was requested that I prepare an Ordinance vacating the 60' right of way and granting a 20' ingress/egress easement where I understand a driveway is located so as to not land lock a parcel on the west side of the existing right of way.

As discussed, the Village has the authority to fully or partially vacate a right of way pursuant to 65 ILCS 5/11-91-1, however, the Village does not have the authority under statute or otherwise to grant or retain an ingress and egress easement on the vacated right of way. As an alternative, the Village could partially vacate the north and south 20' of the right of way leaving the middle 20' identified on the plat of vacation as "ingress and egress easement". It is my understanding that this is not an acceptable alternative as this would not alleviate the maintenance concerns and resolve the underlying issues.

Contractor Company or Companies to which the construction contract was awarded

I. THE ENGINEER AGREES,

1. To perform or be responsible for the performance of the Scope of Services presented in EXHIBIT A for the LPA in connection with the proposed improvements herein before described.

AGREEMENT EXHIBITS

- The Classifications of the employees used in the work shall be consistent with the employee classifications and estimated staff hours. If higher-salaried personnel of the firm, including the Principal Engineer, perform services that are to be performed by lesser-salaried personnel, the wage rate billed for such services shall be commensurate with the payroll rate for the work performed.
- 3. That the ENGINEER shall be responsible for the accuracy of the work and shall promptly make necessary revisions or corrections required as a result of the ENGINEER'S error, omissions or negligent acts without additional compensation. Acceptance of work by the LPA or DEPARTMENT will not relieve the ENGINEER of the responsibility to make subsequent correction of any such errors or omissions or the responsibility for clarifying ambiguities.
- 4. That the ENGINEER will comply with applicable Federal laws and regulations, State of Illinois Statutes, and the local laws or ordinances of the LPA.
- 5. To pay its subconsultants for satisfactory performance no later than 30 days from receipt of each payment from the LPA.
- 6. To invoice the LPA for Preliminary and/or Design Engineering: The ENGINEER shall submit all invoices to the LPA within three months of the completion of the work called for in the AGREEMENT or any subsequent Amendment or Supplement.
- To submit a completed BLR 05613, Engineering Payment Report, to the DEPARTMENT within three months of the completion of the work called for in this AGREEMENT or any subsequent Amendment or Supplement. The form shall be submitted with the final invoice.
- 8. The ENGINEER or subconsultant shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin or sex in the performance of this AGREEMENT. The ENGINEER shall carry out applicable requirements of 49 CFR part 26 in the administration of United States Department of Transportation (US DOT) assisted contract. Failure by the Engineer to carry out these requirements is a material breach of this AGREEMENT, which may result in the termination of this AGREEMENT or such other remedy as the LPA deems appropriate.
- 9. That none of the services to be furnished by the ENGINEER shall be sublet assigned or transferred to any other party or parties without written consent of the LPA. The consent to sublet, assign or otherwise transfer any portion of the services to be furnished by the ENGINEER shall be construed to relieve the ENGINEER of any responsibility for the fulfillment of this AGREEMENT.
- 10. For Preliminary Engineering Contracts:
 - (a) To attend meetings and visit the site of the proposed improvement when requested to do so by representatives of the LPA or the DEPARTMENT, as defined in Exhibit A (Scope of Services).
 - (b) That all plans and other documents furnished by the ENGINEER pursuant to the AGREEMENT will be endorsed by the ENGINEER and affix the ENGINEER's professional seal when such seal is required by law. Such endorsements must be made by a person, duly licensed or registered in the appropriate category by the Department of Professional Regulation of the State of Illinois. It will be the ENGINEER's responsibility to affix the proper seal as required by the Bureau of Local Roads and Streets manual published by the DEPARTMENT.
 - (c) That the ENGINEER is qualified technically and is thoroughly conversant with the design standards and policies applicable for the PROJECT; and that the ENGINEER has sufficient properly trained, organized and experienced personnel to perform the services enumerated in Exhibit A (Scope of Services).
- 11. That the engineering services shall include all equipment, instruments, supplies, transportation and personnel required to perform the duties of the ENGINEER in connection with this AGREEMENT (See DIRECT COST tab in BLR 05513 or BLR 05514).

II. THE LPA AGREES,

- 1. To certify by execution of this AGREEMENT that the selection of the ENGINEER was performed in accordance with the following:
 - (a) Professional Services Selection Act (50 ILCS 510), The Brooks Act (40 USC 11), and the Procurement, Management, and Administration of Engineering, and Design Related Services (23 CFR part 172). Exhibit C is required to be completed with this AGREEMENT.
- 2. To furnish the ENGINEER all presently available survey data, plans, specifications, and project information.

- 3. To pay the ENGINEER:
 - (a) For progressive payments Upon receipt of monthly invoices from the ENGINEER and the approval thereof by the LPA, monthly payments for the work performed shall be due and payable to the ENGINEER, such payments to be equal to the value of the partially completed work minus all previous partial payments made to the ENGINEER.
 - (b) Final payment Upon approval of the work by the LPA but not later than 60 days after the work is completed and reports have been made and accepted by the LPA and DEPARTMENT a sum of money equal to the basic fee as determined in this AGREEMENT less the total of the amount of partial payments previously paid to the ENGINEER shall be due and payable to the ENGINEER.
- 4. To pay the ENGINEER as compensation for all services rendered in accordance with the AGREEMENT on the basis of the following compensation method as discussed in 5-5.10 of the BLR Manual.
 Method of Compensation:

Lump Sum
Specific Rate
Fixed
Total Compensation = DL + DC + OH + FF
Where:
DL is the total Direct Labor,
DC is the total Direct Cost,

OH is the firm's overhead rate applied to their DL and

FF is the Fixed Fee.

Where FF = (0.33 + R) DL + %SubDL, where R is the advertised Complexity Factor and %SubDL is 10% profit allowed on the direct labor of the subconsultants.

The Fixed Fee cannot exceed 15% of the DL + OH.

5. The recipient shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national original or sex in the award and performance of any US DOT assisted contract or in the administration of its DBE program or the requirements of 49 CFR part 26. The recipient shall take all necessary and reasonable steps under 49 CFR part 26 to ensure nondiscrimination in the award and administration of US DOT-assisted contracts. The recipient's DBE program, as required by 49 CFR part 26 and as approved by US DOT, is incorporated by reference in this agreement. Implementation of this program is a legal obligation and failure to carry out its terms shall be treated as violation of this AGREEMENT. Upon notification to the recipient of its failure to carry out its approved program, the Department may impose sanctions as provided for under part 26 and may, in appropriate cases, refer the matter for enforcement under 18 U.S.C. 1001 and/or the Program Fraud Civil Remedies Act of 1986 (31 U.S.C 3801 et seq.).

III. IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED,

- 1. No work shall be commenced by the ENGINEER prior to issuance by the IDOT of a written Notice to Proceed.
- To maintain, for a minimum of 3 years after the completion of the contract, adequate books, records and supporting documents to verify the amount, recipients and uses of all disbursements of funds passing in conjunction with the contract; the contract and all books, records and supporting documents related to the contract shall be available for review and audit by the Auditor General, and the DEPARTMENT: the Federal Highways Administration (FHWA) or any authorized representative of the federal government, and to provide full access to all relevant materials. Failure to maintain the books, records and supporting documents required by this section shall establish a presumption in favor of the DEPARTMENT for the recovery of any funds paid by the DEPARTMENT under the contract for which adequate books, records and supporting documentation are not available to support their purported disbursement.
- 3. That the ENGINEER shall be responsible for any and all damages to property or persons arising out of an error, omission and/or negligent act in the prosecution of the ENGINEER's work and shall indemnify and save harmless the LPA, the DEPARMTENT, and their officers, agents, and employees from all suits, claims, actions or damage liabilities, costs or damages of any nature whatsoever resulting there from. These indemnities shall not be limited by the listing of any insurance policy.
 - The LPA will notify the ENGINEER of any error or omission believed by the LPA to be caused by the negligence of the ENGINEER as soon as practicable after the discovery. The LPA reserves the right to take immediate action to remedy any error or omission if notification is not successful; if the ENGINEER fails to reply to a notification; or if the conditions created by the error or omission are in need of urgent correction to avoid accumulation of additional construction costs or damages to property and reasonable notice is not practicable.
- 4. This AGREEMENT may be terminated by the LPA upon giving notice in writing to the ENGINEER at the ENGINEER's last known post office address. Upon such termination, the ENGINEER shall cause to be delivered to the LPA all drawings, plats, surveys, reports, permits, agreements, soils and foundation analysis, provisions, specifications, partial and completed estimates and data, if any from soil survey and subsurface investigation with the understanding that all such material becomes the property of the LPA. The LPA will be responsible for reimbursement of all eligible expenses incurred under the terms of this AGREEMENT up to the date of the written notice of termination.
- 5. In the event that the DEPARMENT stops payment to the LPA, the LPA may suspend work on the project. If this agreement is suspended by the LPA for more than thirty (30) calendar days, consecutive or in aggregate, over the term of this AGREEMENT, the ENGINEER shall be compensated for all services performed and reimbursable expenses incurred as a result

- of the suspension and resumption of its services, and the ENGINEER's schedule and fees for the remainder of the project shall be equitably adjusted.
- 6. This AGREEMENT shall continue as an open contract and the obligations created herein shall remain in full force and effect until the completion of construction of any phase of professional services performed by others based upon the service provided herein. All obligations of the ENGINEER accepted under this AGREEMENT shall cease if construction or subsequent professional services are not commenced within 5 years after final payment by the LPA.
- 7. That the ENGINEER shall be responsible for any and all damages to property or persons arising out of an error, omission and/or negligent act in the prosecution of the ENGINEER's work and shall indemnify and have harmless the LPA, the DEPARTMENT, and their officers, employees from all suits, claims, actions or damages liabilities, costs or damages of any nature whatsoever resulting there from. These indemnities shall not be limited by the listing of any insurance policy.
- 8. The ENGINEER and LPA certify that their respective firm or agency:
 - (a) has not employed or retained for commission, percentage, brokerage, contingent fee or other considerations, any firm or person (other than a bona fide employee working solely for the LPA or the ENGINEER) to solicit or secure this AGREEMENT,
 - (b) has not agreed, as an express or implied condition for obtaining this AGREEMENT, to employ or retain the services of any firm or person in connection with carrying out the AGREEMENT or
 - (c) has not paid, or agreed to pay any firm, organization or person (other than a bona fide employee working solely for the LPA or the ENGINEER) any fee, contribution, donation or consideration of any kind for, or in connection with, procuring or carrying out the AGREEMENT.
 - (d) that neither the ENGINEER nor the LPA is/are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible or voluntarily excluded from covered transactions by any Federal department or agency,
 - (e) has not within a three-year period preceding the AGREEMENT been convicted of or had a civil judgment rendered against them for commission of fraud or criminal offense in connection with obtaining, attempting to obtain or performing a public (Federal, State or local) transaction; violation of Federal or State antitrust statutes or commission of embezzlement, theft, forgery, bribery, falsification or destruction of records, making false statements or receiving stolen property,
 - (f) are not presently indicated for or otherwise criminally or civilly charged by a government entity (Federal, State or local) with commission of any of the offenses enumerated in paragraph e and
 - (g) has not within a three-year period preceding this AGREEMENT had one or more public transaction (Federal, State or local) terminated for cause or default.

Where the ENGINEER or LPA is unable to certify to any of the above statements in this certification, an explanation shall be attached to this AGREEMENT.

- 9. In the event of delays due to unforeseeable causes beyond the control of and without fault or negligence of the ENGINEER no claim for damages shall be made by either party. Termination of the AGREEMENT or adjustment of the fee for the remaining services may be requested by either party if the overall delay from the unforeseen causes prevents completion of the work within six months after the specified completion date. Examples of unforeseen causes include but are not limited to: acts of God or a public enemy; act of the LPA, DEPARTMENT, or other approving party not resulting from the ENGINEER's unacceptable services; fire; strikes; and floods.
 - If delays occur due to any cause preventing compliance with the PROJECT SCHEDULE, the ENGINEER shall apply in writing to the LPA for an extension of time. If approved, the PROJECT SCHEDULE shall be revised accordingly.
- 10. This certification is required by the Drug Free Workplace Act (30 ILCS 580). The Drug Free Workplace Act requires that no grantee or contractor shall receive a grant or be considered for the purpose of being awarded a contract for the procurement of any property or service from the DEPARTMENT unless that grantee or contractor will provide a drug free workplace. False certification or violation of the certification may result in sanctions including, but not limited to suspension of contract on grant payments, termination of a contract or grant and debarment of the contracting or grant opportunities with the DEPARTMENT for at least one (1) year but not more than (5) years.

For the purpose of this certification, "grantee" or "Contractor" means a corporation, partnership or an entity with twenty-five (25) or more employees at the time of issuing the grant or a department, division or other unit thereof, directly responsible for the specific performance under contract or grant of \$5,000 or more from the DEPARTMENT, as defined the Act.

The contractor/grantee certifies and agrees that it will provide a drug free workplace by:

- (a) Publishing a statement:
 - (1) Notifying employees that the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensing, possession or use of a controlled substance, including cannabis, is prohibited in the grantee's or contractor's workplace.
 - (2) Specifying actions that will be taken against employees for violations of such prohibition.
 - (3) Notifying the employee that, as a condition of employment on such contract or grant, the employee will:
 - (a) abide by the terms of the statement; and
 - (b) notify the employer of any criminal drug statue conviction for a violation occurring int he workplace no later than (5) days after such conviction.
- (b) Establishing a drug free awareness program to inform employees about:
 - (1) The dangers of drug abuse in the workplace;
 - (2) The grantee's or contractor's policy of maintain a drug free workplace;

- (3) Any available drug counseling, rehabilitation and employee assistance program; and
- (4) The penalties that may be imposed upon an employee for drug violations.
- (c) Providing a copy of the statement required by subparagraph (a) to each employee engaged in the performance of the contract or grant and to post the statement in a prominent place in the workplace.
- (d) Notifying the contracting, or granting agency within ten (10) days after receiving notice under part (b) of paragraph (3) of subsection (a) above from an employee or otherwise, receiving actual notice of such conviction.
- (e) Imposing a sanction on, or requiring the satisfactory participation in a drug abuse assistance or rehabilitation program.
- (f) Assisting employees in selecting a course of action in the event drug counseling, treatment and rehabilitation is required and indicating that a trained referral team is in place.

Making a good faith effort to continue to maintain a drug free workplace through implementation of the Drug Free Workplace Act, the ENGINEER, LPA and the Department agree to meet the PROJECT SCHEDULE outlined in EXHIBIT B. Time is of the essence on this project and the ENGINEER's ability to meet the PROJECT SCHEDULE will be a factor in the LPA selecting the ENGINEER for future project. The ENGINEER will submit progress reports with each invoice showing work that was completed during the last reporting period and work they expect to accomplish during the following period.

- 11. Due to the physical location of the project, certain work classifications may be subject to the Prevailing Wage Act (820 ILCS 130/0.01 et seq.).
- 12. For Preliminary Engineering Contracts:
 - (a) That tracing, plans, specifications, estimates, maps and other documents prepared by the ENGINEER in accordance with this AGREEMENT shall be delivered to and become the property of the LPA and that basic survey notes, sketches, charts, CADD files, related electronic files, and other data prepared or obtained in accordance with this AGREEMENT shall be made available, upon request to the LPA or to the DEPARTMENT, without restriction or limitation as to their use. Any re-use of these documents without the ENGINEER involvement shall be at the LPA's sole risk and will not impose liability upon the ENGINEER.
 - (b) That all reports, plans, estimates and special provisions furnished by the ENGINEER shall conform to the current Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction, Bureau of Local Roads and Streets Manual or any other applicable requirements of the DEPARTMENT, it being understood that all such furnished documents shall be approved by the LPA and the DEPARTMENT before final acceptance. During the performance of the engineering services herein provided for, the ENGINEER shall be responsible for any loss or damage to the documents herein enumerated while they are in the ENGINEER's possession and any such loss or damage shall be restored at the ENGINEER's expense.

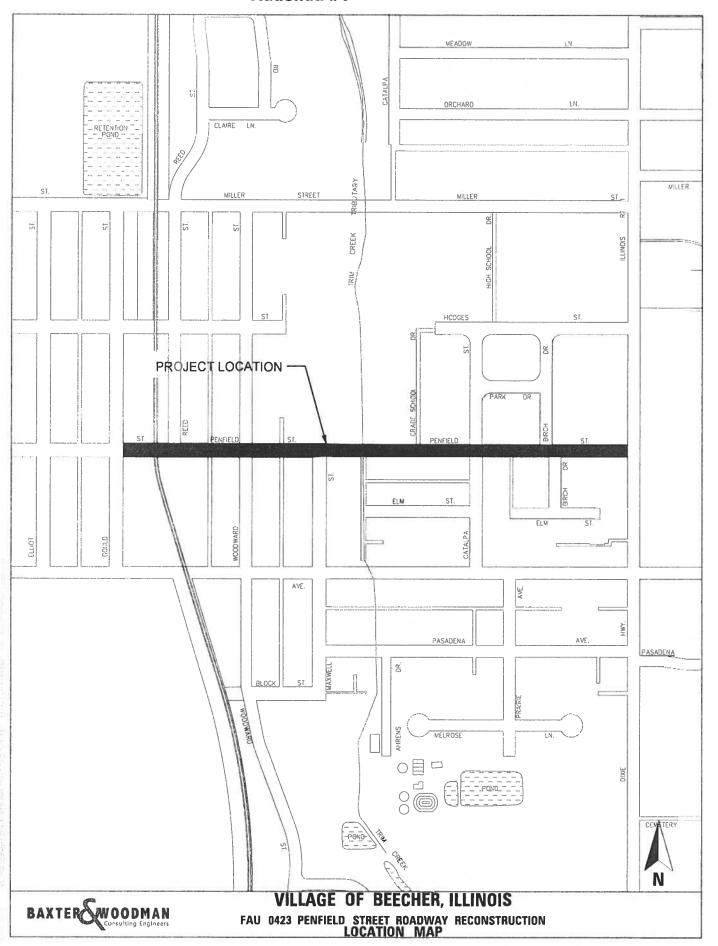
