On 12-8-24, Gilberto Benitez-Castaneda, 34, of Chicago was stopped for a cell phone violation and found to have a revoked driver's license. He was arrested, processed, charged with both offenses and released on a notice to appear.

On 12-16-24, James Kelly, 30, of Justice was stopped for a vehicle equipment violation and having a registration that expired in 2021. A check of his driver's license revealed that it was suspended. He was issued citations for the three offenses and for not having insurance and released on a notice to appear.
